He also shared his excitement for Balmain's new addition to the company. "He's [Piombini] ambitious – that's what Balmain needs right now."

In addition to changes within the board, Balmain is adding a showroom at their new headquarters in Paris, making a comeback in the fragrance department and increasing the amount of stores they have worldwide. There have just opened their first store in New York and plan on opening locations in Miami and Los Angeles.

"There is a great opportunity in the market," says Piombini. "Balmain is one of the best hidden secrets, because it's not developed at full potential yet, and so with the support of Olivier and a structure that we have and that we are going to reinforce, I think we're going to have a great future."

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
